

The diploma named "100 ° AEREO ROMA-TOKIO" was created by the ARI Section of Thiene, with the patronage of the Municipality of Thiene, to remember the enterprise of our fellow citizen Arturo Ferrarin who left Centocelle on February 14, 1920 and arrived in Tokyo on May 30 after over 18,000 km and 109 flight hours.

The Rome-Tokyo air raid carried out by Arturo Ferrarin and his faithful motorist Gino Capannini was an exceptional undertaking, considering the times and the remarkable contribution made by an Italian pilot of the First World War to the progress of the flight.
